National Bullying Prevention Month

A very important part of our school counseling program and guidance standards is how to identify and prevent bullying. During the month of October, students will learn in guidance lessons the definition of bullying, the types of bullying, how to decipher between bullying and conflict, ways to resolve conflict, and how to be an 'upstander'. Being an 'upstander' means the student actively participates in standing up for the student affected by bullying behaviors. Some research defines the other student roles as upstanders vs. bystanders and other students who assist, resist, or defend. In all classes, we will discuss what each student can do to prevent and report bullying behaviors as well as what to do if they cannot safely help the affected student. Bullying prevention is a top priority at DGF because feeling safe is the necessary foundation for kids to be happy and successful learners.



October 8th, 2024

I. Call to Order (11:04 AM)

- a. The meeting was called to order at 11:04 AM by SAC Chairperson, Nicole Gambia.
- b. DGF Principal, Mr. Ken Kirk, welcomed everyone to the first SAC meeting of the 2024-2025 school year and provided a brief overview and explanation of the functions of the SAC and their quarterly meetings.

II. Roll Call (11:0 5 AM)

- a. SAC Officers, voting members, and designated members were introduced.
- b. Rota's School Liaison Officer (SLO), Randy Lambert, was introduced.
- c. All attending school staff were introduced.

III. Attendance by Sign-In

- a. This was completed for those individuals attending the meeting in-person.
- b. As a reminder, attendance is available virtually via Microsoft Teams.

IV. Principal Report/School Updates (11:06 AM)

- a. School Enrollment and Staffing: The school currently has 569 students enrolled, with 11 new students pending. There are several open positions, including aides for Prekindergarten, Kindergarten, and SPED, as well as teaching positions in Kindergarten, Prekindergarten, and 4th grade (the 4th grade position will be announced in conjunction with a December teacher departure). Additionally, the school is looking to fill an Administrative Officer role and a half-time School Counselor position. Recent staffing updates include the arrival of Shannon Sherwood as the new School Psychologist, starting October 15th, and the anticipated arrival of Tynia Hopkins, tentatively starting as School Counselor on January 6th.
- b. School Events for October and November: Several key events are scheduled for October and November, including the Hispanic Heritage Event on October 15th in collaboration with Naval Station Rota's Diversity Committee and Unity Day on October 16th, featuring a musical performance from second grade. The PTSA will host a Halloween Craft event on October 23rd, and a Book Fair from October 28th to November 1st; Red Ribbon Week will take place during that same period. Additional highlights include a Character Parade on October 3 lst, Bingo Night on November 15th, and the Turkey Trot Fun Run on November 22nd. The Turkey Trot Fun Run is the largest fundraiser of the year; all funds will go toward DGF to support various efforts including the Toro Store.

- c. Important Dates for October and November: October and November have several no-school days, including October 10th, 1lth, and 14th due to a federal holiday, and October 25th for a Teacher Workday. The first quarter ends on October 24th. November also has key dates, such as Parent-Teacher Conferences on November 7th and 8th (approximately 15-20 minute sessions), no school on Veterans Day (November 1lth), and Thanksgiving Break from November 27th to 29th.
- d. Student Supports: Student support programs include "Lemon Chat," a series of small group sessions for students in grades 1-5, running from September 20 24 to June 20 25. The Family Deployment Support Group, led by Military Family Life Counselors, meets on the third Thursday of each month, with upcoming meetings scheduled for October 17th, November 14th, and December 19th. A monthly support group focused on children's mental health meets on the first Wednesday of each month, offering strategies for managing stress and supporting students. These support groups are intended to provide opportunities to discuss and connect with other families, as we all navigate the challenges faced with raising children overseas.
- e. School Reminders: Flu vaccine clinics will be held at the Navy Exchange on October 16th and 17th, with additional vaccines available at Rota Elementary on November 7th and 8th. Flu vaccines are required; waivers will have to be completed for those students with extenuating circumstances (religious, medical, etc.). Students exhibiting illness symptoms such as fever or lethargy will be sent home and can return to school after being fever-free for 24 hours without medication. Consistent school attendance is emphasized, with prompt communication for absences appreciated. Students are also reminded to follow the school's electronic device policy to maintain a focused learning environment.

V. Open Issues (11:17 AM)

a. Advanced Academic Program and Services (AAPS): Mr. Tutti, the AAPS instructor, presented an overview of the Gifted & Talented Program, explaining the recent shift from a traditional pull-out model to a more inclusive, in-classroom approach. In this new model, the AAPS instructor co-teaches with classroom teachers, designing project-based learning activities that foster creative and critical thinking. Flexible grouping is used during instructional time to enhance engagement. These lessons are shared with other grade-level teachers, allowing for consistent implementation across classrooms. This inclusive approach enables the AAPS instructor to reach more students while reducing missed class time. Based on AAPS testing results, eligible students may receive additional instructional time, either in-class or outside the classroom. Recent AAPS testing for all second graders was completed during the week of October 1-4, and results will be reviewed to determine eligibility for increased AAPS services. Additional AAPS testing is conducted in third grade, and all students, regardless of

- grade-level, who enter a DODEA school with identified AAPS services receive instruction at DGF.
- b. Spanish Language Classes and Activities: A request was made for more Spanish language offerings as part of the after-school activities, with additional suggestions that all students receive daily Spanish instruction, given the school's location in Spain. In response, it was noted that DODEA curriculum standards and funding for Spanish language instruction have evolved over the years. Around six to seven years ago, DGF had a full-time Spanish language instructor, but this position was eventually eliminated. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the school did offer an elementary Spanish immersion program, which unfortunately had to be discontinued due to health-related protocols. Currently, Spanish is taught through a Host Nation "specials" class, where students receive 45 minutes of instruction each week. This class is conducted approximately 80% in Spanish and focuses on aspects of Spanish history, culture, and traditions. In addition, students in grades K-2 attend a separate 45-minute Spanish language class that introduces them to basic language skills. However, due to the required instructional time dedicated to core subjects such as math, reading, and phonics, additional classroom time for Spanish instruction is not feasible. Despite these constraints, it was acknowledged that there could be opportunities to expand Spanish instruction outside of regular class time. Should there be sufficient interest, the school could consider offering Spanish as an after-school club, provided funding and a suitable sponsor can be secured to support the program.
- c. After School Clubs: A request was made for additional after-school clubs, with a wide range of suggestions such as board games, soccer, STEM, Roman history, archaeology, geology, film, art history, cooking, aviation, engineering, and more. While DGF currently offers several clubs—including violin, free play, chess, gardening, fitness, art, running, and Anchored for Life—there is potential to expand these offerings. The establishment of new clubs depends primarily on two factors: available funding and finding a certified sponsor to lead the club. DODEA schools receive designated funds for clubs, so there may be resources to support new activities. Teachers are the first candidates considered to lead these clubs, followed by substitutes if no teacher is available. Moving forward, the review of current and potential future club offerings has been taken as an action item (see Meeting Minutes Section IX) for further consideration. Clubs may operate for various lengths throughout the school year, ranging from full-year programs to semester or quarterly offerings. Most clubs typically run from October through May. To ensure the school community is well informed, communication regarding club openings and start dates will remain transparent and consistent, continuing through established channels such as Mr. Kirk's weekly updates, the DGF Facebook page, and the school website.
- d. School Lunch Times: Concerns were raised regarding the early lunch times, with some students eating as early as 10:00 10:30 AM. These early meal

- times are due to the shared use of the cafeteria between elementary, middle, and high school students, requiring coordination to serve approximately 1,000 meals daily. To address this, students are given scheduled snack breaks throughout the day, which are also used to incorporate Social Emotional Learning (SEL) instruction.
- e. Student Meal Services: Concerns were expressed about the high amount of processed foods in school lunches, such as pizza, hamburgers, and waffles, and the impact these meals may have on students' health and cognitive functions. While fruits and vegetables are provided, there is worry that this doesn't compensate for the overall unhealthy options, nor does it promote healthy eating habits. However, DGF is unable to modify the menu, as school nutrition standards are set by the USDA. These standards are implemented and overseen by the Navy Exchange (NEX), which works with an awarded contractor and sources food from the commissary to execute the program.

VI. Open Session (not to exceed 15 minutes) (11:58 AM)

- a. Accelerated Reader: A question was brought up as to whether or not DGF uses the Accelerated Reader program. DGF does not use the Accelerated Reader program, as DODEA schools do not fund/ implement the program as a part of their curriculum.
- b. Playground Lighting: Mr. Kirk raised awareness regarding lighting on the DGF playgrounds, as there have been concerns as to whether lighting is actually sufficient for students early in the morning, as students are on the playground early in the morning, prior to sunrise.
